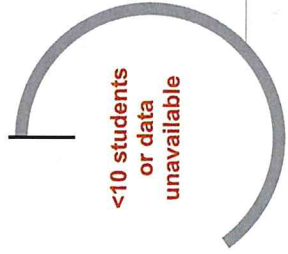

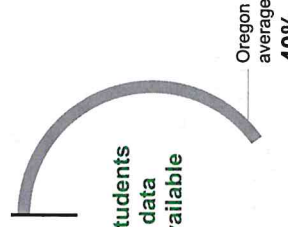

Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

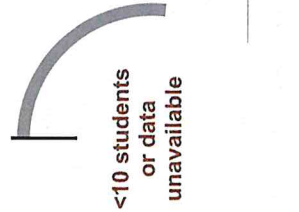

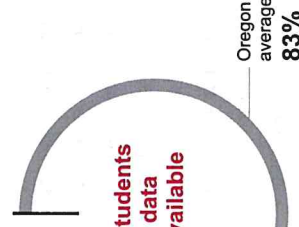

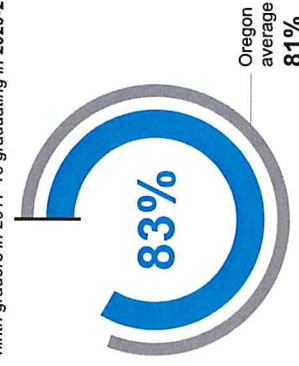

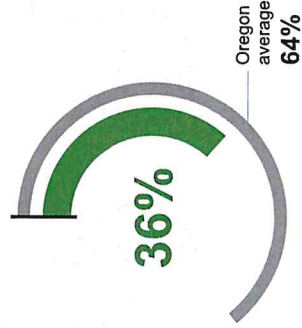
CLASS SIZE

Median size of classes in core subjects.



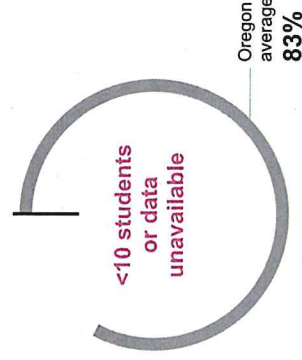

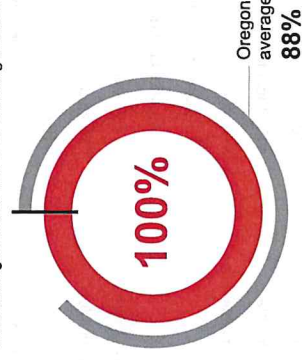

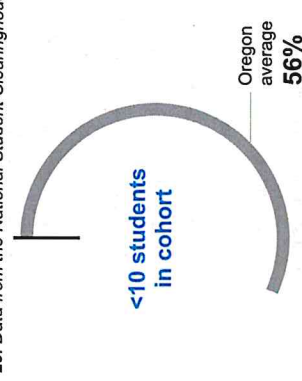

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Safe & Welcoming Environment

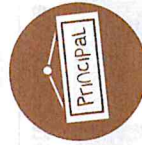

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Despite our small size we provide opportunities for advanced placement classes through a variety of online offerings. We offer dual enrollment with several post-secondary institutions for interested students. Career directed coursework is also available for students through the High School Success Program. Staff works closely with parents and students to ensure that student career goals are defined and supported throughout their academic experience.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Long Creek School has a long history of providing CTE education to our students. CTE programs for Long Creek High School Students include: Cooking and Nutrition Education, Consumer Finance Education, Photography, Journalism, Coding and Web Design, and Online offerings of a variety of CTE courses.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

As a result of our small size, our students have an opportunity to develop leadership skills that might not be available in a larger school. Long Creek School offers the following extracurricular activities to students: Girls Volleyball, Soccer, Boys and Girls Basketball, Track and Field, and Golf. Community volunteering opportunities are available and encouraged. Field trips and other opportunities are available including with the North Fork John Day Watershed Council, Yearly Ski Trip, Yearly Hockey Game, 4-H photography club is available from 1st grade onward. Elementary students participate in the Annual Elks Hoop Shoot.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Long Creek School is a community hub and a valuable extension of this close knit community. We host a variety of events for parents and community members to attend: Back to School and End of Year Barbecues, Homecoming celebration, Halloween Party, Theatrical productions, Veteran's Day Presentation, Annual EMS Thank You Dinner, Holiday Celebration Meal, and Awards Presentation Nights. Our school partners with our local watershed to provide our students with classroom and hands on activities to educate and involve them in our local ecosystems. We partner with businesses and agencies to provide our senior students with opportunities for vocational exploration. Our staff and students also enjoy making a distributing holiday cookies within our community every year.
